At the \$2,500 fundraising milestone, each team member will receive a personalized item with their team name and a picture of their loved one with Down syndrome. Previous items have included lanyards, buttons, and key chains.

#### Wakefield

The Top 5 Teams at the Buddy Walk & Family Festival (Wakefield) will receive a tent and banner with their team name as well as an MDSC picnic blanket. The top five teams will also receive a cooler with snacks and refreshments.

All other teams who raise over \$5,000 for the Wakefield Walk will be given a designated picnic area on the common for their team and an MDSC picnic blanket. These teams will also receive a cooler stocked with snacks and refreshments.

### Falmouth & Uxbridge

All teams at the Buddy Walk by the Sea (Falmouth) or Buddy Walk & Harvest Fair (Uxbridge) who raise over \$5,000 will receive team tents and banners. They will also receive an MDSC picnic blanket and a cooler with snacks and refreshments.

#### **MDSC Buddy Walk Fun Pack**

All Team Captains of teams who raise \$5,000+ will receive an MDSC Buddy Walk Family Fun Pack with items such as games, sports balls, art projects and other fun items for team members to enjoy throughout the day.
